What's a walkabout?

A "neighbourhood walkabout" is a community event where residents walk around a specific area, identifying issues, concerns, and potential improvements to enhance the neighborhood's safety and quality of life.

This is an opportunity for us to foster a sense of community ownership and pride and gather data to inform future projects and initiatives aimed at improving the neighbourhood.

Walkabouts can address a wide range of issues and target areas of concern, including:

- Safety concerns (e.g., traffic problems, lack of street lighting).
- Infrastructure problems
(e.g., potholes, damaged sidewalks, fences falling down).
- Cleanliness issues (e.g., litter, graffiti).
- Parking problems.
- Fly-tipping (garbage dumping).
- Anti-social behaviour or crime-related issues.
- Vacant property issues
- Minor private property improvements.

Coordinate with your neighbours ... do your block
Document the issues ... take pictures of problem areas.

What you need: clipboard, pen, camera, AND someone who writes clearly!

- What do you love about your block!
- What represents the Newcastle Neighbourhood to you?
- Take a picture of your favourite houses/ green spaces.
